### EDITORIAL:

### CRAFT CONTACTS

THE CABC ANNUAL MEETING IS APRIL 23, 1977 AT 2:00 PM AT THE SOFIA RESTAURANT, 1251 HOWE STREET, VANCOUVER, B.C. PLEASE TRY AND ATTEND, BUSINESS, FOLK DANCING AND FINE FOOD ALL ON THE AGENDA!

- This month the newsletter shall be devoted to a report by President, Walter Dexter, who attended a western regional conference of Canadian Crafts Council (CCC) in Saskatoon. From his report you will read that CCC has finally found an objective, has been working on funding, communication and starting a resource centre. In the latter respect we urge you to take the time to FILL OUT IN FULL THE QUESTIONNAIRE which you will be receiving from the CCC in the next week or so. This is to YOUR advantage as it will, for the first time, indicate to government the number of craftspeople in Canada and the necessity for a well-regulated and on-going funding program in order to give crafts a market place in Canada and the world.

### CANADIAN CRAFTS COUNCIL:

- "The Saidye Bronfman Annual Award for Excellence in the Crafts". This award, which will be made through CCC by the Saidye Bronfman Family Foundation, is for \$15,000 per year for 10 years, \$10,000 to go to the craftspeople and \$5,000 per year to a travelling exhibition of the work of the person chosen. Qualifications include: Canadian citizenship, recipient has already made a major contribution for a significant period and the criterion for judgment is outstanding quality of work. Judges to be President of the CCC, Chairman of exhibiting committee of CCC, a nominee from the Bronfman Foundation, and one other person appointed by the first three persons. The date of presentation will be on the birthdate of Mrs. Saidye Bronfman, December 9th of each year. Calls for nomination will be made by the CCC.
- "National Collection of Contemporary Arts". The CCC has a five year agreement with the Massey Collection to collect art-craft pieces. So far 40 items have been purchased.
- WCC Biennial Assembly will be in Kyoto, Japan, September 1978. Canada has been allotted 100 places. There will be a quota for British Columbia. Criteria is: craftspeople is a member of CCC and has an on going commitment to crafts and who on return is willing to undertake at least one public presentation of his/her experience or some similar activity of benefit to the craft community. If interested in attending please write to Gail Rogers, CABC office. (No CABC travel assistance available). For complete trip \$1000 to \$1800 excluding Canadian air travel to point of charter. This includes travel to Japan from point of charter, hotel and conference fees. Spouses and children will travel at reduced rates but cannot attend the conferences.
- National Travelling Exhibition. The guidelines set out by CCC are as follows: 1. selectors are, two from CCC, Mariette Rousseau-Vermette and Virginia Watt plus a provincial selector chosen by the executive

of the CABC, 2. all pieces for selection must be for sale, 3. all pieces will receive a rental of 2% of value per month with a minimum of \$50 per annum, 4. it is intended the exhibition will travel from coast to coast. As more news of this exhibition comes to our office we will publish information.
