POT SHOP & GALLERY

In 1972, CLAY WORKS became the name for twelve potters who rented a warehouse in Richmond. With the help of a Canada Council Explorations grant, they collectively built a 200 cubic foot car kiln, raku kilns and a 100 cubic foot salt kiln and darkroom. They worked, each independently, in this studio for ten years. Simultaneously, a shop/gallery was established on Robson Street which became the exclusive outlet for seven of the CLAY WORKS artists. The POT SHOP & GALLERY became well known and appreciated for innovative pottery priced by the potter. The uniqueness of decoration and forms combined with the extensiveness of the selection, made this shop a legend. There is a full range of work from sculptural to functional--in porcelain, stoneware, raku and earthenware, with photo decals, brushwork and pencil drawings.

In 1982, CLAY WORKS leased a large building from the Granville Island Trust. This provides studio space for nine members and one guest artist, a dark room area for photo decal preparation and a gallery to display unique pieces.

Both the POT SHOP & GALLERY at 1723 Robson Street and at 1359 Cartwright Street display the creative work of a talented group of people who have established themselves as innovative, dedicated and honest artists who look forward to working in a new location and anticipate exciting changes and growth in their exploration of clay.
