

BIOGRAPHICAL NOTES

Léopold L. Foulem was born on April 4, 1945 in Caraquet, New Brunswick. In 1964 Mr Foulem began to study ceramics at the New Brunswick Handicraft School in Fredericton, after which he went to the Institute of Applied Arts in Montreal for two years. He transferred to the Alberta College of Art in Calgary and graduated from this institution in 1969. Léopold has also studied at the famous Haystack Mountain School of Crafts in Deer Isle, Maine, U.S.A. at three different times and has received two Ceramic Monitor Scholarships from this school - which he considers quite an honor. He also attended Sheridan College School of Design in Port Credit, Ontario for a year. Mr Foulem taught Ceramics at: "Le Cegep du Vieux Montréal", a summer session at Haystack in 1972, at the University of Calgary in 1972 - 1973, at the Visual Arts Center, Montreal in 1975, and is presently teaching again at "Le Cegep du Vieux Montréal".
